Build America, Buy America: How BABA Impacts CAA Programs

Federal grant recipients such as Community Action Agencies (CAAs) working on public infrastructure projects will now need to ensure the supplies and materials they purchase are primarily manufactured in the United States. The Build America, Buy America Act (BABA, or Buy America) applies a domestic content procurement requirement to federally funded public infrastructure projects, meaning that certain supplies purchased with federal funds are required to be manufactured primarily in the United States. Existing "Made in America" laws already required this for iron, steel, and certain manufactured goods, and BABA now extends the requirement to nonferrous metals, such as copper, plastic and polymer-based products, glass, optical fiber, and other construction materials such as lumber and drywall.

NCAP's 2023-2024 Public Policy Priorities

NCAP has released its 2023-2024 Public Policy Priorities! The updated priorities are the product of a 10-month review process, including six national listening sessions, over 100 anonymous survey responses, and input from NCAP Board Members, stakeholders, partners, and staff.

NCAP continues to prioritize many of the policy positions from the 2021-2022 platform, but the updated priorities include additions that are crucial to the work of Community Action, including:

- NCAP's vision for how to use the priorities effectively
- New highlight box-outs on Tribal Issues, a Whole Family Approach to providing services, Federal Poverty Measurements, and Social Determinants of Health
- Expanded section on Immigration policy priorities
- Policies addressing appraisal bias and disparities in rates of home-ownership
- Opposition to education policies that limit or prohibit learning about the history, cultural experience, and identity of historically marginalized populations and communities
- Policies addressing cost-prohibitive dental care, including access and reforms
- Expanded Climate Change section that explicitly links the climate crisis to poverty and populations served by CAAs

Mutual Reinforcement for Two-Generation Initiatives: A New Measurement Tool

Since 2019, the federal government has sponsored Next Steps for Rigorous Research on Two-Generation Approaches (NS2G) to strengthen initiatives that aim to support child development and improve family economic security. One objective of the NS2G project was to develop and test a draft measure of two-generation initiative functioning. In this session, you will learn about the Two Generation Mutual Reinforcement Measurement Tool that Mathematica developed, provide a live demonstration, discuss how you might use this tool within your agency and with your partners, and answer any questions you have.

EmPower+ Program

<u>EmPower+</u> helps low and moderate-income households save energy and money toward energy improvements made to their property. Households can get up to \$10,000 towards improvements! The program is open to income-eligible owners and renters of 1-4 family members.

Through EmPower+:

• Households can receive a no cost comprehensive home energy assessment to pinpoint where energy

and dollars are being wasted and receive a customized plan to lower energy usage.

- No-cost direct install improvements identified during the assessment can be installed by participating program contractors.
- Households can receive financial discounts on the cost of energy efficiency improvements.



NY State of Health - Important Changes to New York Medicaid, Child Health Plus and the Essential Plan

Do you or a family member currently have health insurance through New York State Medicaid, Child Health Plus or the Essential Plan? Starting in Spring 2023, New York State will resume eligibility reviews and renewals for people enrolled in these programs. This means you may need to take action to renew your health insurance or the insurance of your family members. Here are some things you can do now to get ready.

Sign up for text alerts.

Sign up to receive SMS/MMS Text alerts from NY State of Health so you don't miss important health insurance updates, including when it's time to renew your coverage. - To subscribe, text START to 1-866-988-0327.

Make sure your address is up to date.

Make sure NY State of Health has your current mailing address, phone number and email address so they can contact you about your health insurance. To update your information:

- Call NY State of Health at 1-855-355-577
- Log into your account at <u>nystateofhealth.ny.gov</u>, or
- Contact an <u>enrollment assistor</u>

If you enrolled in Medicaid through <u>your county's Medicaid</u> office or through New York City's Human Resources <u>Administration</u>, contact that office to update your address and contact information.

Take action

When it is time to renew your health insurance, you will receive a letter from NY State of Health or a renewal packet if you enrolled through your county's Local Department of Social Services or the New York City Human Resource's Administration. This letter/packet will let you know what you need to do to renew your coverage and how much time you have to respond. Follow the instructions right away.

What if you don't qualify for Medicaid, Child Health Plus or the Essential Plan?

If you or a family member no longer qualify for Medicaid, Child Health Plus or the Essential Plan, you may be eligible to enroll in a Qualified Health Plan (QHP) through NY State of Health. NY State of Health offers a broad choice of QHPs with comprehensive benefits. More people than ever are qualifying for financial assistance to pay for their premiums. NYS MyBenefits Tool Connects Residents to Benefit Programs

NYS has released an online tool for State residents. This resource allows individuals to check eligibility for multiple human services benefit programs and apply online for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP), and Temporary Assistance.

2023 Kids Count Data Book: State Trends in Child Well-Being

Safe, reliable childcare has been inaccessible and unaffordable for too many Americans. Disparities between those who can and cannot afford childcare reflect structural inequities in the United States. Shift workers, single parents, student parents, and families of color are significantly affected by the failings of the childcare system. Inadequacies of the childcare system hinder family economic mobility and perpetuate generational wealth gaps. The 2023 Annie E. Casey Foundation KIDS Count® Data Book describes how the country's lack of affordable and accessible childcare negatively affects children, families, and U.S. businesses. The report presents national and state data across four domains — economic well-being, education, health, and family and community — and ranks states in overall child well-being.

Resources for Populations Served by ACF Programs

The Administration for Children and Families' (ACF) has developed a set of materials intended to provide guidance to hard-to-reach populations to increase their awareness and understanding of the array of resources that may be able to assist them. These resources are explicitly designed to be user-friendly and easy to digest. The materials include resources for transition-age youth exiting foster care, families with children ages 0-12, prospective Head Start participants, survivors of domestic violence looking to find and keep housing, fathers looking for benefits programs or parenting tips, and providers supporting those seeking post-disaster housing.
