2020-21 CSBG CARES Act

- Under the **Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act** (CARES Act), Public Law 116-136 (2020), the state must use CSBG CARES Act funds to help prevent, prepare for, or respond to the coronavirus.
- Expect increased attention and increased scrutiny!

2020-21 CSBG CARES Act (continued)

- States are tasked with distributing CARES Act funds within 30 days. DOS is working to get the Contracts out asap (within the next few days).
- One contract will cover the entire CARES Act period of **April 1, 2020 through September 30, 2022**. Amendments will likely be needed throughout contract period.
- The CARES Act specifies that Income eligibility level “*is changed to not to exceed **200 percent** of the official federal poverty line for services provided in **FFY’s 2020 and 2021**, including services furnished with the state’s regular CSBG appropriations during those years*”

2020-21 CSBG CARES Act (continued)

- All CSBG CARES Act Funds must be fully spent by **September 30, 2022.**
- Still waiting on guidance from OCS regarding:
 - Community Needs Assessment (CNA) – basic template provided in DOS CSBG CARES Act Contract
 - Income eligibility level for 2022 will change back to 125% FPL (unless there is a change).

2020 CSBG Discretionary Contract

- Contracts are currently being processed.
- Income eligibility level is **200%** of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL) for services provided.
- Track activities and outcomes separately from other CSBG Contracts – **Contract Period is 3/1/20 through 9/30/20 only.**
- Agencies can include a **Work Plan Close Out Narrative - due October 31, 2020.**
- Agencies should collect demographic and NPI data on those served. This can be included in the **2020 CSBG Annual Report** (SmartForms)

2020 CSBG Contract Amendment

- Amendments are due **May 21, 2020**.
- Income eligibility level is **200% FPL** for services provided (consistent with 2020 CSBG CARES Act).
- Quarter 2 PPR only required a narrative on program performance.
- Quarter 3 PPR should include actual outcomes achieved for the second and third quarter.

FFY 2020 was the beginning of a 5 year contract. Year one of the contract is the actual contract for the multiyear contract period. Each year after that is considered an amendment to the original contract.



We kept your starting allocation at the same amount as the final allocation in FFY 2019 and then estimated a slight increase every year.



Once DOS receives the final allocation, we issue an amendment to reflect the actual allocation.

2021 CSBG Refunding Contract

- Amendments are due **June 5, 2020**.
- Income Eligibility is **200% FPL** for services provided (consistent with 2020 CSBG CARES Act).
- Funded at FFY 2020 level (until final FFY 2021 federal budget is approved)

2022 CSBG Refunding Contract

- Will be issued in Spring 2021.
- Income Eligibility will be **125% FPL** (reverts back to pre-CARES Act level due to lack of language in the current legislation).

2019 CSBG Annual Report

- DOS will be receiving Modules 2 & 4 and will enter this information provided by the agencies directly into the SmartForms.
- DOS may have questions or require clarification as this is completed

2020 CSBG Annual Report Period

- 2020 Annual Report covers October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020
- Four CSBG Contracts touch this time frame
- **This is another opportunity for Community Action in New York State to Shine!!**
- What should be included in the 2020 Annual Report:
 - All CSBG funds allocated during this period
 - Demographics on all new service recipients (including COVID-19)
 - All applicable Strategies and Services codes along with all NPI related outcomes

II. Program Specific Clauses – CSBG Discretionary

A. Purposes, Goals, Assurances, and Limitations:

The Department of State is the officially designated State agency responsible for the implementation of the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) programs in accordance with the terms of the federal CSBG Act and in furtherance of the purposes and goals expressed therein (42 U.S.C. § 9901, et seq.).

1.00 CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable provisions of the following statutes, regulations, policies and procedures, which are incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth in text:

a. Statutes:

- i. Title II of Public Law 105-285, as amended (42 U.S.C. § 9901, et seq., as amended);
- ii. NY Executive Law Article 6-D, as amended;

b. Regulations:

- i. 2 CFR Part 376 – Nonprocurement Debarment and Suspension;
- ii. 2 CFR Part 382 – Requirements for Drug-Free Workplace (Financial Assistance);
- iii. 45 CFR Part 16 – Procedures of the Departmental Grant Appeals Board;
- iv. 45 CFR Part 30 – Claims Collection;
- v. 45 CFR Part 75 – Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles and Audit Requirements for HHS Awards;
- vi. 45 CFR Part 80 – Nondiscrimination Under Programs Receiving Federal Assistance through the Department of Health and Human Services, Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964;
- vii. 45 CFR Part 81– Practice and Procedure for Hearings Under Part 80 of this Title;





- xviii. Title 19, New York Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations, Part 144.


